Our Mission & Vision

The mission of New Jersey AIDS Services is to respond compassionately and responsibly to the HIV/AIDS crisis by providing supportive services, housing opportunities, prevention strategies and community education. It is our vision to help create a community where the social issues related to HIV/AIDS are abundantly met.

Residential Programs

Transitional Housing Program: The Eric Johnson House, located in downtown Morristown, is designed for individuals who are homeless due to their HIV status. The facility has the capacity to house ten individuals at a time for a period of up to 24 months as they locate the resources and develop the skills necessary to obtain and maintain permanent housing. Individuals who enter the Eric Johnson House come primarily from living on the streets, places not meant for human habitation, or in emergency shelters.

Permanent Housing Program: This program administers housing subsidies for rental assistance to enable HIV positive persons to afford independent living. Participants are required to pay 30% of their income towards rent and the housing subsidy pays the difference directly to the landlord.

Community Based Services

Case Management: This program helps to navigate and coordinate the complex social service system thus ensuring clients and their families have access to all available medical and supportive services that may help to optimize their life situations.

Mental Health Services: These services are designed to help infected and affected persons address the complex issues surrounding a HIV diagnosis. Clients in this program receive in-home and/or office based weekly/bi-weekly therapy sessions as well as group therapy services provided by one of our state licensed clinicians.

Substance Abuse Counseling: These services consist of individual sessions as well as community centered Relapse Prevention groups. This service allows clients with a history of substance abuse access to critical counseling services designed to help address issues that have contributed to their substance abuse.

Transportation Services: These services allow clients who cannot access public transportation the means necessary to attend critical medical and social service appointments.

Food Pantry Assistance: This service is available for Community Case Management clients in the form of direct food assistance, as well as shopping vouchers. This service helps to ensure the nutritional needs of HIV positive people are met.

Community Education & Prevention

Youth Education: Staff and trained professionals from New Jersey AIDS Services visit Elementary, Middle and High Schools throughout the year to help educate youth about HIV/AIDS. A comprehensive presentation is given detailing the modes of transmission, risky behaviors, and general HIV/AIDS facts. This is followed by an experiential presentation given by a client of New Jersey AIDS Services discussing their experiences in living with HIV. While our clients are already infected with HIV, it is our aim to prevent future infections in others.

Community and Corporate Education: New Jersey AIDS Services provides HIV/AIDS training to any corporation or community organization interested in scheduling a presentation. Staff will discuss the modes of transmission, risky behaviors, and workplace issues related to living with HIV/AIDS.
